This notice is to inform you that the San Joaquin River Restoration Program (SJRRP) will be conducting aerial surveys of the San Joaquin River from Friant Dam to the Merced River confluence, Chowchilla Bypass, Eastside Bypass, and Mariposa Bypass.

Who: Bureau of Reclamation

What: As a component of the SJRRP, Reclamation is working to evaluate inundation at different flow rates and vegetation in the Restoration Area. Aerial surveying provides the most cost effective means to gather inundation data to validate hydraulic modeling results and produce vegetation maps.



Local residents and property owners may see Reclamation staff placing aerial survey markers in the public right-of-way and limited private properties. Staff will use public access points and the public right-of-way for activities related to the aerial surveys wherever possible, but limited private properties may need to be accessed for this work.

When: The groundwork portion of the Aerial Surveys is scheduled to begin the week of March 28, 2011, and conclude by April 8, 2011. All work will be conducted between sunrise and sunset.

Where: San Joaquin River (Friant Dam to Merced River confluence), Chowchilla Bypass, Eastside Bypass, Mariposa Bypass.
