Field Activity Advisory October 26, 2012

The San Joaquin River Restoration Program (SJRRP) plans to conduct traffic surveys as part of the Reach 4B, Eastside Bypass, and Mariposa Bypass Channel and Structural Improvements Project between October 30 and November 1, 2012.

Who: Bureau of Reclamation, California Department of Water Resources, CDM Smith, National Data and Surveying Services

What: The traffic surveys include traffic counts at three intersections in the Reach 4B Project area. Counts will be completed from 7-9 a.m. and 4-6 p.m. for two consecutive days. One person will be stationed at each intersection during these periods. The surveyors will be counting vehicles that turn at each intersection to collect traffic data to evaluate construction traffic related impacts of the Reach 4B Project. The surveyors will access the survey area by vehicle and foot. Surveyor vehicles will be parked just off the road near the intersections and surveyors will remain on the side of the road for traffic counts. There will be no activity on private property. Surveyors will not interrupt traffic flows and no physical equipment is needed to conduct the surveys.

When: Traffic surveys are planned for 2 consecutive days between October 30 and November 1, 2012. Counts will be completed from 7-9 a.m. and 4-6 p.m.

Where: Surveys will be conducted at three intersections:

- Turner Island Road/Henry Miller Road
- Washington Road/Harman Road
- Turner Island Road/Highway 152
