Field Activity Advisory Predator Assessment May 19 – June 27, 2014

This notice is to inform you of an upcoming research study to collect data that will help the San Joaquin River Restoration Program (SJRRP) assess the current status of predatory fish populations in existing captured mine pit habitat in Reach 1 of the Restoration Area. There will be limited opportunities for essential data collection and this study will assist the SJRRP in determining fish needs and restoration needs in this area.

Who: U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS)

What: Electrofishing boats and small jon boats will be used for fish sampling, and deploying nets. Field activities include boat electrofishing, gill netting, and gut content collection (gastric lavage). Individuals captured will be identified, weighed, measured, and tagged with an external tag that will provide individual identification (e.g., numbered floy tags). All field activities will take place between dawn and dusk, with no overnight sampling. All nets set in the water will be monitored by field staff until retrieved.

Environmental disclosure documents including a California Environmental Quality Act Notice of Exemption and a National Environmental Policy Act Categorical Exemption are available upon request.

The information collected through the study will support decisions related to spring-run and fall-run Chinook salmon reintroduction and habitat restoration of mine pit habitat.

When: Between May 19 and June 27 (18 days), crews will be sampling by boat to capture predatory fish species in predator habitat.

Where: Sampling will occur from River Mile 260 just upstream of Hwy 41 to River Mile 231, downstream of Hwy 145 (map below).



Access will occur from the public right-of-way or in areas where private landowners have approved access.
